WHAT'S STAMMERING?



Stammering, also called Stuttering, is a neurological condition that makes it physically hard to speak.

Someone who stammers will repeat, prolong or get stuck on sounds or words.

There might also be signs of visible tension as the person struggles to get the word out.

STAMMERING FACTS & THE STIGMA SURROUNDING IT

- About **8% of children stammer at some point.** Most will go on to talk fluently.
- About 2% of adults stammer all their life.
- There is no link between stammering and intellectual capacity. It has nothing to do with flaws in someone's character.
- Like other neurological conditions, it covers a spectrum. There'll be periods when a person stammers less and other times when they stammer more.



WHAT CAUSES STAMMERING?

Researchers currently believe that stuttering is caused by a combination of factors, including genetics, language development, environment, as well as brain structure and function.

Working together, these factors can influence the speech of a person who stammers.

DO YOU KNOW ANYONE WHO HAS STAMMER? WHAT CAN YOU DO TO SUPPORT THEM?

- **Don't finish their sentences** if they're struggling to get their words out.
- **Give them time** to finish what they're saying without interrupting.
- Don't ask them to speak faster or more slowly or to take a breath.
- **Show interest** in what they're saying, not how they're saying it, and maintain eye contact.
